Attracting and Keeping Butterflies in the Garden

Butterfly Garden/Habitat

Create a butterfly habitat with native plants if possible. Include the following in a butterfly garden: *Larval/Host Plants*: Many butterflies depend on specific plants as larval/host plants which provide a place for butterflies to lay their eggs and food the caterpillar needs to survive. Some caterpillars are very need particular food plants – exclusively – or they will starve.

Nectar Plants: Nectar sources provide food for butterflies in their adult stage.

Shelter: Provide places for the butterfly to go when it is hot or windy. A place for caterpillar to make a "J" and become a chrysalis.

Puddles: Provide moist areas of sand or mud for puddle spots that contain nutrients the butterfly needs for reproduction.

Pest Management: Eliminate the use of harmful pest control methods, unnecessary fertilizers and additives that may kill butterflies. Use safe methods of pest control.
