

## Blue Heron Park Wants Butterflies!

Eastbluff has the opportunity to help the environment and provide a beautiful educational opportunity for our children, but we need your help! The plantings on the slope in Blue Heron Park need replacement. Pollinators such as butterflies, including the endangered Monarch, and hummingbirds are struggling to survive in our increasingly urban world with its plastic grass and concrete. We have the opportunity to replace the aging plants in Blue Heron Park with native flowering plants which provide food and a safe haven for butterflies. The Pollinator Protection Fund, a 501(c)(3) conservation and education organization dedicated to the creation, conservation, and rehabilitation of habitat for Monarch butterflies, has provided the Eastbluff HOA Board a beautiful design for part of the slope in Blue Heron Park and around the monument sign; see the Eastbluff HOA website for plans. Because predominantly native plants will be used, we will be saving water and restoring the area to a more natural look. The Eastbluff HOA Board has agreed to fund half the cost, but help is needed to raise the remaining \$10,000. Will you pledge a donation to the Pollinator Project to help fund the garden?
